
Christmas Post

Art in Year 3

Year 3 are learning about the Rainforests so in Art we have been learning about Henri Rousseau.

We sketched his 'Tiger in a Storm' and then worked in pairs using oil pastels to create our own versions of this stunning piece of art. We found that we could blend colours, be bold (or not) and create depth using the pastels in different ways. Lots of smudgy fingers!

<u>Did you know?</u> Henri Rousseau only started painting seriously when he was in in his forties. He was a self-taught painter and, as a result, his

work is often described as naive or child-like. Rousseau became a full-time artist at the age of 49. He was an accomplished violin player, and he often supplemented his income by playing as a street musician. Although some of Rousseau's most well-known paintings are of jungle scenes, he never set foot in a jungle. Instead, he took his inspiration from the 'Jardin des Plantes' (botanical gardens) in Paris and illustrations in books.

On the day of the latest Global Climate Strike and a day after the European Parliament declared a climate emergency, the Young People's Trust for the Environment (YPTE) has produced an information sheet for parents, which gives them some basic information about climate change, why it is such an important issue and how it may affect them and their children.
