Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back!

I hope you have had a good summer break and are looking forward to returning to school routines again. We are excited to bring all children back into school, having spent considerable time preparing classrooms and working through risk assessments in line with Government guidance. For those children who have not been in school during the lockdown period, the school environment may look and feel a little different. Please check your class blogs on the school websites to have a preview.

Safety

Our risk assessments have been checked by the DMAT health and safety lead, Joe Wood as well as teachers' unions during the summer holidays. Please refer to the school website in order to see your school's document.

I am confident that the procedures that we have in place will enable all of our children to return safely into school as from Tuesday 8th September. We have installed wall-mounted sanitisers at each classroom door, in every learning space and floor mounted units at the main entrance to the schools buildings. Frequent handwashing and twice daily cleaning of key areas is now the norm in our routines. Staggered arrival and departure times, as well as separate play spaces for each class bubble will ensure that we can maintain the required social distancing. Please help us by arriving promptly at designated times and also maintaining a 2m distance from other families when bringing or collecting your child from school.

We are pleased to be re-opening our class libraries with the added precaution of hand sanitising prior to entry daily and set return dates twice a week. These will enable us to quarantine returned books for a period of 72 hours before replacing books on shelves.

Lunches

We will be offering packed lunches in the first instance, for all children which will be eaten in the classroom. This enables children to remain in their class bubbles at the moment, but we are keen to keep reviewing guidance and hope to work towards offering hot meals as we assess how the social distancing situation progresses over the coming weeks. We understand that many parents prefer their child to have a hot meal and in preference may choose to provide their own packed lunch to begin with. We would be grateful if you would make your weekly choices clear through the School Gateway so that we can prepare accordingly.

Marie Bunclark, our catering manager at Chagford will now be managing the food provision at our other two schools as well, North and South Tawton – a change from last year, when they worked under the guidance of Chartwells. This recent change is being worked through carefully and we wish Marie well with this new responsibility! We will continue to support and review systems regularly to ensure that we are providing children with as healthy and tasty food as possible.

School Websites

The curriculum will shortly be available for you to look at on each of our new school websites. Staff will be providing a brief overview each week on their class blogs, so you can keep up to date with what is happening in school. These are also linked to the school newsletter for ease. Keep checking back as we continue to update our websites.

Uniform

We are keen for all children to enjoy their return to school and establish routines which are as normal as possible. Please help us by ensuring that your child arrives looking clean and smart in their school uniform. As we have re-worked our school logos during the past 6 months, we will be reviewing our school uniform with a view to incorporating the new logos as a matter of course, from next academic year. School skirts and trousers are expected to be grey school uniform standard, polo shirts, jumper/cardigan, and sensible black school shoes please.

We are always ambitious to continue to develop and enhance the educational offer at our schools and we have exciting aspirations to introduce new opportunities, improve the school environment and learning spaces. There is an intercom which will be answered by the school office.

We look forward to the specialist sports coaching taking place on **Wednesdays and Thursday afternoons** at South Tawton. So please ensure that clean PE kit is always available on this day, in addition to each class timetabled PE session, which you will be informed about soon.

Mrs Marvin will be teaching on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday afternoons, with our Three Hares Heads meeting taking place on Thursday afternoons. Please be understanding of this in terms of her availability to communicate with parents during the school day.
