PE – We are completing our Cat themed PE activities with this challenge. You can use the cat moves you have learnt to collect all the hidden ‘mice’ around the room. You could use socks, toys or make your own mice using toilet roll tubes. Can you move forwards and backwards as a cat and travel with the mice on your back to return them to your cat bed. *You could time yourself if you want an extra challenge.*

Complete a shape hunt at home (see class webpage). How many squares, rectangles, circles, semi circles, triangles can you find? You could make a list, take photos, gather them into groups.
I wonder, what is the biggest triangle you can find?

Funky Fingers- ask an adult draw around some large 2D shapes on paper or with chalk on the floor. Select small items to lay over the edges. (for example, beads, stickers, Lego, playdough, buttons, coins)



Pet collage- using an outline of an animal or pet, make your own collage. (Some can be found on the class webpage)
You could use paint, paper, wool, fabric, cardboard, plastic etc.
